## CONTEXT

**Biographical/Administrative History:** Hugo Frederick Garten: born Hugo Friedrich Königsgarten, Brünn [now Brno], Moravia, 13 April 1904, into a Jewish family. Educated at a Gymnasium in Berlin, and the Universites of Jena (1923), Vienna (1923-1924), Berlin (1924-1926) and Heidelberg, where he obtained his doctorate in 1930; free-lance writer in Berlin, 1928-1933; moved to Vienna, 1933 and London, 1938; teacher at New College School, Oxford, 1940-1945, and member of staff of 'Die Zeitung', London, 1941-1944; DPhil, Oxford, 1944; taught modern languages at Westminster School, 1946-1965; Lecturer at the Universities of Surrey and London 1965-. He was a member of the International PEN Club, the English Goethe Society and the Gerhart Hauptmann-Gesellschaft.

Married Anne Leonard Smith, 1952, no children.

## CONTENT

**Scope and Content:** Papers of Hugo Frederick Garten (formerly Hugo Friedrich Königsgarten) (HFG), including correspondence with the expressionist playwright Georg Kaiser (GK) and his wife Margareta from the 1920s to 1940s; typescripts of work by GK; periodicals, programmes and photographs relating to productions of GK's plays; correspondence from the German playwright Gerhart Hauptmann (GH) and members of his family to HFG; newspaper cuttings on GH and his plays written on centenary of his birth in 1962; photographs of GH and letters from GH to the German Studies scholar Hermann Georg Fiedler; and letters from Stefan Zweig, Fritz von Unruh, Jakob Wassermann and his wife, Martha Wassermann-Karlweis, Robert Neumann, Friedrich Gundolf, and Alfred Weber to HFG. Also includes five metal plate prints of letters by and portraits of Gerhart Hauptmann.

### HFG 1 Papers relating to Georg Kaiser

Material accumulated during the course of H.F. Garten's (HFG) work with and concerning the German playwright, Georg Kaiser (GK). Includes correspondence from GK and his wife Margareta to HFL from the 1920s to the early 1940s; typescripts of work by GK; and journal and newspaper articles, programmes and photographs relating to GK and productions of his plays. There is also a small amount of material relating to the GK Archive at the Akademie der Künste, Berlin.

## HFG Letters from Georg Kaiser to H.F. Garten1/2 (photocopies)

Photocopies of letters from Georg Kaiser (GK) to H.F. Garten (HFG) in Vienna. The letters are not dated but some are headed Grünheide, where GK lived from the 1920s until 1938; others are headed Scheveningen, which was GK's first place of exile after he left Germany in 1938; and some are headed Engelberg, where GK stayed until 1944. Subjects include: GK's play 'Rosamund Floris' and the possibility of having it performed and published in Austria; GK's next play, which he called 'Jahr Viertausend'; HFK's plans for GK's play 'Mississippi'; GK's plans to travel to Greece, Sicily and Switzerland; GK's sense of loss of time and 1921-1969

place; GK's suggestion that he and HFG work together to produce film scripts of GK's plays; GK's manuscript of 'Der Gärtner von Toulouse' and his request that HFG send it to send it to publishers in Switzerland; GK's offer to help get HFK's book, '[Platons] Staatsgründung' published; GK's request that HFG send him the film script HFG had written of GK's play 'Nebeneinander'; relations with the publishers Felix Bloch Erben; the publication of GK's books in Argentina and by Querido Verlag. typescript with hand-written annotations of Georg Kaiser's play, 'Twice Oliver: a play in three parts', originally written and published in German in 1926; the translator is unknown. There are also five letters addressed to Dr [later Professor, J.M.] Ritichie from H.F. Garten, concerning their collaboration over the translation of various plays by Georg Kaiser, including 'Die Bürger von Calais' and 'The Raft of the Medusa'. Although it is not clear what the relationship is between the correspondence and the typescript, these items were deposited as one unit by J.M. Ritchie in 1997. Previously in HFG/box2/file1.

Includes newspaper and reviews and typescripts of newspaper reviews of productions of Georg Kaiser's (GK) plays; (1920s and undated [1940s?]); a typescript of a radio speech written by Bernhard Diebold after

GK's death (7 June 1945); two theatre programmes of productions of GK's plays in Germany (1952, 1956); editions of academic journals (or extracts from them) of articles in German, English and French on GK, mostly written by H.F. Garten (1948-1969); an edition of the weekly journal, 'Das Tage-Buch' (Berlin), containing a letter by Georg Kaiser, 'Brief über sich selbst'; various typescripts of short pieces of writing by GK's, including 'The Island of Ever Lasting Life' in English (originally 'Die Insel der tausendjährigen Menschen') (undated but the typescript ends with a note that the story was related in Scheveningen in 1938 and written down in St Moritz in 1943); 'Dichtung und Energie' (1922), and the outline for a play later written by Fritz Hochwälder, 'Der Flüchtling' (undated but the outline was written in 1944). There is also a portrait photograph of GK (1930). Previously in HFG/box1/file6.

## HFG Photographs and letters of Gerhard Hauptmann2/3 and Hermann Georg Fiedler

1903-1969

Contains copies of letters from Gerhart Hauptmann (GH) to the German Studies scholar, Hermann Georg Fiedler (HGF) (1903-1932), and photographs of GH in various locations which were in an envelope marked 'presented by Miss H. Fiedler, July 1970'. These include two photographs of GH with HGF; two of GH at celebrations for his 60th birthday in Breslau in 1922, which were attended by the German President [Friedrich] Ebert; one of GH with the director of Stadttheater Aachen at a production of 'Vor Sonnenuntergang' in Aachen in 1932; two oversize portrait photographs of GH; and miscellaneous others of GH at his home and elsewhere. There is also a handwritten list of books relating to GH and a typescript of items in the Fiedler Hauptmann Collection at the Taylor Institute, Oxford University (1969). Correspondence and photographs relating to other 1924literary figures (apart from Gerhart Hauptmann and undated Georg Kaiser) [c1972] Contains the following items of correspondence to H.F. Garten: -card from Jakob Wassermann (17 September 1924) -2 letters from Friedrich Gundolf (6 January 1929 and 22 June 1930) -card from Professor Alfred Weber (6 August 1933) -letter from Martha Wassermann-Karlweis (26 November 1935) -card and letter from Stefan Zweig (31 March 1938 and 11 May 1939) -letter from Robert Neumann, discussing the Laterndl exile theatre (22 June 1939) -5 letters from Carl Zuckmayer (2 May 1959, 29 July 1959, 6 February 1960, 15 April 1961, 8 March 1967) There are also 2 photographs with corresponding negatives of the German Studies scholar, Karl Breul (KB). One of them is a portrait photo taken in Berlin in July 1885 and the other shows KB playing the violin with his sister [not named] next to him and her later husband, Eugen Braunholtz (EB), playing the cello. The portrait photograph is dated 31 July 1885 and other one is probably from c. 1878. However, neither the negatives nor the photographs are the originals, which, according to notes on the verso of photographs, were in the possession of EB's son (in the case of the group photograph) and his nephew (Professor G.E.K. Braunholtz) in the case of the portrait photograph. An accompanying envelope for the negatives states that the photographs should have been printed in sepia (undated, c. 1972). #### HFG 5 Metal plate prints of letters by and portraits of undated

### Gerhart Hauptmann

This file contains wooden blocks with attached metal plate prints of the following:

1: plate of an extract of a letter to an unknown recipient concerning support for the naturalist writer, Felix Holländer, signed 'In vorzüglicher Hochachtung' ('Respectfully yours') by Gerhart Hauptmann (GH), Theodor Fontane, Friedrich Spielhagen, Erik Schmidt, Max Liebermann (ML), Ernst von Wildenbruck and Paul Schlenther.

2: plate of a letter from GH to ML, stating that he (GH) would come to ML's house the following day.

3. plate of GH's signature

4. plate of a head and shoulders portrait of GH, based on a published photograph.

5. plate of a full-length portrait of GH in his D.Litt graduation gown [in the gardens of Oxford University?]. There are corresponding images of print-outs of all the plates except GH's signature. None of the plates or print-outs is dated. However, a note accompanying the blocks states that three of them were used in H.F. Garten's catalogue of the Gerhart Hauptmann Exhibition to celebrate his centenary in 1962. This was held under the auspices of the Institute of Germanic Studies. There is also an additional note stating that it was not clear where two of the plates had been published(sic!), but it seems likely that all five were produced at the same time.
