CONTEXT:

Name of creator: Émile Cammaerts

Administrative/Biographical History:

Émile Cammaerts (1878-1953) was born in Brussels (he was baptized Émile Pieter at the age of 34). He was educated at the University of Brussels and later at the revolutionary Université Nouvelle where he studied geography.

Cammaerts held the post of Professor of Belgian Studies and Institutions in the University of London, 1931-1947, and became Professor Emeritus after his retirement from the university in 1947. He also received an honorary LL.D. from the University of Glasgow and a CBE. He was a fellow of the Royal Historical Society.

During his life, Émile Cammaerts was a cartographer, geographer, journalist, poet, playwright, historian, art critic and devoted Anglican. He was Belgian by nationality, and deeply immersed in Belgian politics and culture. Cammaerts moved to England in 1908 and married the Shakespearean actress (Helen) 'Tita' Brand (1879-1963), daughter of the opera singer Marie Brema (1856–1925). They had two sons; Pieter died in the Second World War while serving in the RAF, and Francis (1916-2006), an prominent intelligence officer. Cammaerts spent his life in England at Radlett, Hertfordshire, from where he commuted to his office in London. He died in 1953 at his home at Radlett, Hertfordshire.

Archival history:

Deposited in 1969, originally on permanent loan, by Mrs. Joan Lindley, daughter of Professor Cammaerts. A gift agreement transferring ownership to Senate House Library was signed in 2019. Copyright was also transferred to Senate House Library.

Scope and Content:

The collection contains correspondence, books and personal papers relating to Émile Cammaerts, poet, royalist, Belgian patriot and Professor of Belgian Studies and Institutions in the University of London. The papers relate to Belgian and British affairs, also art, literature, theatre, politics, the press, religion and the two world wars.
