

MS867 Frank Sydney Milligan papers 1924-1966

Correspondence, printed items, reports, lectures, photographs, unpublished autobiographical material, and other items relating to the work of adult educationalist and lecturer, Frank Sydney Milligan (1894-1965).

Administrative papers, printed items, photographs, and other items relating to educational centres for the unemployed: Beechcroft, Birkenhead; Merseyside; Darnhall, Cheshire; and Wincham Hall, Northwich, Cheshire.

Printed items and reports collected by F.S. Milligan relating to adult education in general.

The papers were accumulated by Frank Milligan during his time as warden of Beechcroft, Darnhall and Wincham Hall and provide details of the running of these institutions, and the subject of adult education, education for the unemployed, and community learning in general.

These letters were received by Frank Milligan in his capacity as warden of Beechcroft and Wincham Hall and are of a non-personal nature. They contain attachments, usually printed, that were sent with the letters. The content of the correspondence in the years up to September 1939 largely relates to the administration of Beechcroft and Wincham Hall, and the education of the unemployed. From the outbreak of the Second World War, however, the letters are concerned with the administration of evacuation, the welfare of families, and the education of members of the armed forces. The correspondents are most commonly representatives of local and national organisations concerned with welfare of unemployed men and their families including: Liverpool Council of Social Service, National

Council of Social Service, British Institute of Adult Education, British Broadcasting Corporation's North-Western Area Council for Broadcast Adult Education and Central Committee of Group Listening, Educational Settlements Association, Workers' Educational Association, The World Association for Adult Education, and Lancashire and Cheshire community councils. To a lesser extent there are personal letters relating to evacuation, letters from accountants and suppliers of goods to Wincham Hall, and letters from the Central Advisory Council for Adult Education in H.M.
