MS944 Elvey family and Skeats family papers

c1770c1870

The material consists of various manuscript books which were deposited as part of Sir George Elvey's library. Some of this manuscript material reflects the Elvey family's connections and interests, as it contains music for use in church, and music written by people such as Highmore Skeats (MS944/5/1-8) and Dr William Crotch (MS944/4/3). The music contained within the manuscripts covers a wide spectrum, including songs, music for piano, orchestral works, pieces for the organ, choral works for use in church, and chamber music. The books which belonged to Stephen Elvey (MS944/2/1-3) are of interest because they contain copies of some little known pieces. The printed books contained within the library are now in the care of the Music Department of Senate House Library.

These three manuscript books were given to Stephen Elvey by a Mr Williamson in August 1827. It is likely that the early string music that they contain was already copied into them. Elvey has used empty sections of the manuscript paper to write notes and exercises. The books also contain fair copies of choral works by Stephen Elvey.

This manuscript book has been started at both ends - one cover is labelled 'Basso Gambo - Williamson' and the other 'No. 7 MSS 1827'. At the end labelled 'Basso Gambo' the book contains pieces by J.C. Bach, Maxhumble, F. Abel, G. Sandoni, and A. M. Besseghi. The pieces by Sandoni and Besseghi are marked as being for 'Viol di Gambo'. The first page in this section has been labelled in pencil in a later hand as 'A collection of church music by S. Elvey, Vol III', but these pieces were not copied by Stephen Elvey. At the end labelled 'No. 7 MSS' the book contains a copy of 'Evening Service to Dr Crofts' by Stephen Elvey, and other choral church music by him. The volume also contains some fragments of

compositions, probably Stephen Elvey's own, and musical notes and exercises.

This manuscript book has been started at both ends - one cover is labelled 'No. 5 - Violino Primo Gambo - Williamson' and the other 'No. 5 MSS 1827'. At the end labelled 'Violino Primo' the book contains string pieces by J.C. Bach and Maxhumble. There are also notes on musical theory possibly written by Stephen Elvey, including some entitled 'On Modulation'. On the first page of this section there is a pencil note in a later hand describing the volume as 'a collection of church music by S. Elvey, Vol II', but the string pieces copied here are not in Stephen Elvey's hand. At the end labelled 'No 5 MSS' the inside cover is signed 'Stephen Elvey, the gift of J. Williamson, Esq., 1827, Canterbury'. J.Williamson has also signed this page. This section of the book contains choral music written for use in church, some of which is by Stephen Elvey. The book also contains fragments of compositions probably written by Elvey. and musical exercises.

At the end labelled 'No 6 MSS' the inside cover is signed 'Stephen Elvey, Canterbury', and there is a note recording that the song 'Come oh Come' was published on October 2, 1827. This part of the book contains choral music for use in church.
