MS1152/box 1/file 1/1	[Undated] 1923	Why Labour left the Coalition	Author unknown. Published by The Herald. Eight-page pamphlet outlining Labour's key policies post-World War I. Particular emphasis on benefiting the working-class in the community and industry.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/2	1917 December	Satire. Volume 2, No.13	Author unknown. Published by Blackfriars Press. Seven-page paper. Monthly addition of pro-Labour paper. Heavily illustrated. Articles include book reviews and criticism of food standards. Also includes article by the paper's editor on the seizure of Satire copies at St Pancras publishing office.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/3	1915 February	Why Britain Should Disarm	George Benson. Published by the National Press. Fifteen-page suppressed pamphlet on the economic case for non-resistance. Sections include the effect of armament and disarmament. Part II considers the implications of safeguarding disarmed nations. Note on inner page concerning the seizure of pamphlet on October 25 th 1915.

MS1152/box 1/file 1/4	1918 January 1	Labour and The New Social Order: A Report on Reconstruction	Author unknown. Published by W. Speaight & Sons. Twenty-two page draft report by Labour concerning reconstruction policies of the Labour Party. Policies referred to as The Four Pillars of the House. Detailed explanation of policies listed under subheadings.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/5	1915 January	Is Britain Blameless?	Fenner Brockway. Published by the National Labour Press. Fourteen-page suppressed pamphlet adapted from a debate between Fenner Brockway and Professor Ramsay Muir at Manchester University Fabian Society.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/6	1915 May 22	“Letters of a ‘Hun.’”	Published by Burt Bros. Three-page suppressed leaflet containing letters from an anonymous German soldier. Letters strongly condemn the war and are dated between 18 th August – 17 th December (year unknown). Extracts originally appeared in French publication “Foi et Vie”.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/7	[Undated] c1916	An open letter to His Majesty King George V.	Copy of suppressed two-page letter by T. H. Ferris, member of the Brotherhood Church, Leeds. Letter criticises the King’s role in the War and his attitude towards the people. Upon suppression of the letter, T. H. Ferris was condemned to six months’ imprisonment under the Defence of the Realm Act.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/8	[Undated] c1915	Why We Object	Author unknown. Issued by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page pamphlet explaining the fundamental reasons of why those associated with the No-Conscription Fellowship refuse to engage in any form of military service.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/9	1915	British Militarism – A Reply to Robert Blatchford	C. H. Norman. Published by the National Labour Press. Second edition. Eleven-page suppressed pamphlet challenging the allegations of German militarism made by Robert Blatchford in the Weekly Dispatch of November 29 th , 1914. Norman then details accounts of atrocities carried out by the British military as a means of comparison. Suppression of pamphlet was ruled on August 26 th , 1915.

MS1152/box 1/file 1/10	[Undated] c1916	Compulsory Military and Alternative Services and the Conscientious Objector	Author Unknown. Issued by the Non-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page memorandum on why members of Fellowship, or any individual pacifist, should not have to engage in military service despite the passing of the Military Service Act law. Pamphlet details the grounds on which pacifists object to the war and military service.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/11	1914 October	Britain and the War: A Study in Diplomacy	C. H. Norman. Published by the National Labour Press. Twenty-four page pamphlet on the causes and progression of the war. Pamphlet disputes the accepted reasons and is written from an objector's viewpoint. On October 25 th , 1915, Sir John Knill ordered the pamphlet be destroyed.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/12	1915	How the War Came	Author unknown. Published by the Independent Labour Party. Third edition. Eighteen-page suppressed pamphlet on the causes of the war and how to secure a lasting peace. Emphasis on impartially reviewing the facts. Preface explains how earlier editions were criticised for impartiality and subsequently branded as pro-German.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/13	[Undated] c1916 December	A "Knock-out" Blow	Author unknown. Published by the National Labour Press. Fifteen-page pamphlet considering the human and economic cost of the war. Concludes with why Britain and the Allies should now seek peace rather than engage in further warfare. Newspaper cut-out on inner page concerning the suppression of pamphlet and prosecution of those involved with the publication.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/14	1916 June 5	Rex v. Bertrand Russell	Author unknown. Issued by the Non-Conscription Fellowship. Printed by the Victoria House Printing Co, Ltd. Twenty-three page suppressed pamphlet reporting proceedings between the accused, Bertrand Russell, and the Lord Mayor at the Mansion House Justice Room on June 5 th , 1916. Russell was tried and prosecuted for writing "Two years' hard labour for refusing to disobey the dictates of conscience". Various newspaper cut-outs concerning the case on inner page.

MS1152/box 1/file 1/15	[Undated] c1918 January	A Challenge to Militarism	Author unknown. Issued by the Friends' Service Committee. Printed by Andrew Fleming. Seven-page pamphlet containing letters from prisons, guardrooms and court-martial statements by conscientious objectors. Record of imprisoned conscientious objectors, according to occupation, religion and sentences imposed, listed on back page. Newspaper cut-out from The Labour Leader, titled "The Prosecution of the 'Friends'" also included.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/16	1917 August	Tsardom's Part in the War	E. D. Morel. Published by the National Labour Press. Third edition. Thirty-one page pamphlet considering Russia's changing role in the war and the Russian Revolution. Subsequent impact this had on France also considered. Various newspaper cut-outs concerning the pamphlet's subject and Morel's assertions found on front and back pages.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/17	[Undated] c1915	The Causes of War	Author unknown. Published by the National Labour Press. Twelve-page suppressed pamphlet examining the social issues that encourage and perpetuate war. Note on inner page concerning the suppression of pamphlet on August 26 th , 1917. Pamphlet was later returned as its content was deemed too innocent to be brought to the attention of the magistrate.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/18	1915	Belgium and "The Scrap of Paper."	H. N. Brailsford. Published by the Independent Labour Party. Sixteen-page suppressed pamphlet on the invasion of Belgium. Germany's motive for invasion explored as well as the history of treaties and whether they can continue to be justifiable. Two newspaper articles related to the subject, one from a Labour perspective and the other from that of the Tories, to be found on inner page.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/19	1915	Is Germany Right and Britain Wrong?	Clifford Allen. Publisher unknown. Twenty-seven page suppressed pamphlet adapted from a speech given by Allen on international and national Socialist and Labour Movements. Germany's geographical and political position considered. Note on inner page concerning the seizure of pamphlet on August 18 th , 1915.

MS1152/box 1/file 1/20	c1915	Is Britain Blameless? With Letter from G. Bernard Shaw	Fenner Brockway and Bernard Shaw. Published by the National Labour Press. Second edition of item 5. Fifteen-page suppressed pamphlet adapted from a debate between Fenner Brockway and Professor Ramsay Muir at Manchester University Fabian Society. Preface by Shaw on the importance of proceeding points made by Brockway.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/21	1916 January 4	An Open Letter to the Organised Workers of Great Britain	Dmitri Anitchkin; Secretary, Russian Seaman's Union. Open letter to organised workers and Labour Solidarity over the seizure of papers and correspondence. It is claimed that all seized documents contain no political content concerning the war and are only relevant to the industrial organisation of the union. Letter suppressed by the Police.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/22	c1916	The Chaos of Conscription	Author unknown. Issued by the National Council Against Conscription. Printed by Victoria House Printing Co Ltd. Four-page leaflet on the case for repeal against conscription. Numerous tribunals and their details listed.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/23	1915	Russia Dominates The World	Luis Jackson. Published by Percival Mullikin Co. Third edition. Twelve-page pamphlet on Russia's military mobilisation and the government of Czar. Czar explored in both a national and international context.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/24	1915 November 27	Conscription and Conscience	Clifford Allen. Published by the National Labour Press. Fifteen-page suppressed pamphlet adapted from a speech delivered by Allen to the National Convention of the No-Conscription Fellowship. Allen addresses the ways and means of resistance to conscription, both military and war-work, in conclusion of the voluntary recruiting effort.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/25	1915	Persia, Finland, and our Russian Alliance	Author unknown. Published by the Independent Labour Party. Twenty three-page suppressed pamphlet on Britain's diplomatic relationship with Russia. Franco-Russian alliance considered. Persian national rights and Finland's involvement also explored. Note on inner page concerning the seizure and subsequent suppression of pamphlet on October 25 th , 1915.

MS1152/box 1/file 1/26	1913	The Mission of the Quakers	Edward Grubb. Published by the Friends' Tract Association. Third edition. Sixteen-page pamphlet on the doctrine and theology of the Quakers. The Quakers stance against war noted on page twelve.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/27	1917 October 27	Why a Labour Party?	Author unknown. Published by the Labour Party. Four-page leaflet on the general policies of the Labour Party and justification for its formation.
MS1152/box 1/file 1/28	c1917	The New Constitution of the Labour Party	Sidney Webb. Published by the Labour Party. Four-page leaflet on the proposal to reorganise the Labour Party and the changes this would introduce to Trade Unions, Socialist Societies and other electors. The programme of the Labour Party in relation to new constitution also summarised.
MS1152/box 1/file 2/1	1918 January 2	The Tribunal: No. 139	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication containing New Year messages from readers and members of organisation. Includes letters from Stephen Hobhouse, W. J. Chamberlain and C. H. Norman. Additional articles include Inside the Prison Cells and The Greater Community.
MS1152/box 1/file 2/2	1919 January 16	The Tribunal: No. 141	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Articles include Conscientious Objectors at the Polls, Strikers Released, Military Service and the Mind, and C.O.s in America. Final article titled The Slaughter of the Innocent, reviews the food shortage and famine in Germany.
MS1152/box 1/file 2/3	1919 January 23	The Tribunal: No. 142	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Front page article, titled Since the Armistice, reports how many conscientious objectors re-courtmartialled since the armistice was signed and the reasons for this. Additional articles include Hunger Strikes, American C.O.s Released, In an English Prison, and Our German Comrades.

MS1152/box 1/file 2/4	1919 January 30	The Tribunal: No. 143	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Front page article, titled Because They Love Liberty, explores the reason behind those who have been court-martialled due to their stance of conscientious objectors. Further articles include London Divisional Conference, The Iron Heel, Demobilisation, and No-Conscription Sunday.
MS1152/box 1/file 2/5	1919 February 6	The Tribunal: No. 144	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Front page article, titled The Great Game, includes an extract from H. G. Wells' <i>Joan and Peter</i> (1918). Additional articles include A New Military Service Act, A Case for Release, The Latest Figures, and At His 5 th Court-martial.
MS1152/box 1/file 2/6	1919 February 13	The Tribunal: No. 145	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Front page article, titled 'Artifex' on Persecution, considers the original publication on the continued imprisonment of conscientious objectors which first appeared in the Manchester Guardian on February 6 th , 1919. Additional articles include The Advanced Guard of Freedom, Famine in Europe, A Protest in Prison, and U.S. Sentences Revoked.
MS1152/box 1/file 2/7	1919 February 20	The Tribunal: No. 146	Authors include G. A. Sutherland. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Front page article, titled Conscription – A Warning, addresses the possible contemplation of a new conscription bill and comments made by Lloyd George during the election process of 1918. Additional articles include An Appeal for Unity, C.O. and Demobilisation, C.O.s. in Egypt, and A Protest in Prison (Cont.).

MS1152/box 1/file 2/8	1919 February 27	The Tribunal: No. 147	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Front page article, titled Military Training in Schools, reports on how military training for schoolboys may continue despite the potential cessation of conscription. Article refers to General Smuts, the principal author of the recent scheme for the League of Nations. Additional articles include Mr. Short and C.O.s., News From the Prisons, and Scheme Prisons and Camps.
MS1152/box 1/file 2/9	1919 March 6	The Tribunal: No. 148	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Front page article, titled A Positive Faith, reports on Almer Rose's second court-martial for which he was sentenced to a further two years' hard labour. Rose, former N.C.F. organising secretary, is quoted on his defence. Additional articles include Death of Walter Bone, Home Office Slavery, News From Prisons, and A Prison Manifesto.
MS1152/box 1 /file 2/10	1919 March 13	The Tribunal: No. 149	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Front page article, titled On Doing Nothing, is a prisoner's response to Government remarks that claims imprisoned conscientious objectors avoid useful work. Additional articles include The Herald Petition, M.Ps Who Voted Against the New Conscription Bill, Hunger Strikes, and Scheme Prisons and Camps.

MS1152/box 1/file 2/11	1919 March 20	The Tribunal: No. 150	Author unknown. Published by the No-Conscription Fellowship. Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Front page article, titled Who Are The Offenders? is extract of an article which first appeared in the Manchester Guardian on March 11 th , 1919. The article reports how Lord Hugh Cecil, Conservative Party politician, made disapproving comments on the imprisonment of conscientious objectors. Additional articles include The Outlook, Free Church Council, Hunger Strikes, The Chief Issue, and Remarkable Speech Made By Member of Essex Appeal Tribunal.

Additional articles include Faithful Unto Death, A Prison Strike, Meeting of M.P.s, and Hunger-Striking.

Additional articles include The Only Solution, Prison Strike (Cont.), The Corporal's Story, and The Rising Tide of Protest.

Additional articles include M.P.s and Release of C.O.s, Hunger-Striking, and Pacifist and Peace.

Additional articles include C.O.s Still Going to Prison, Release News, The Work of the Convalescent Fund, Morgan Jones – Deserter, and How the Conscience Men Came Out of Winchester.

Front page article by Chamberlain, titled What is Anti-Militarism?, explores the differences between anti-militarism and anti-capitalism in relation to the proposition to widen the scope of the N.C.F. Additional articles include No More Conscription in Germany, Scraps of Paper, Reward for Three Years' Voluntary R.A.M.C. Service, and What of the Future?.

Additional articles include Militarism in Education, A C.O. Colony, Vocational Training, and The Biology of War.

Four-page weekly publication comprised of articles on the recent developments concerning conscientious objectors. Additional articles include Education and Penalisation, American Militarism, and An Appeal for £10,000.

MS1152/box 1/file 4/2	1915 November	An Earnest Call For Immediate Peace	Stop-the-War Leaflet; No. 2. Author unknown. Published by the British "Stop-the-War" Committee. These include Edmund Burke, Sydney Smith, and John Bright. Suppression of committee's previous publication noted on front page.
