EJD addresses Pollard as "Professor Pollard" but sometimes as "my dear master" and "dear my master." EJD is invited to spend time on holiday with the Pollards (16/7/220) but eventually decides against it (23/7/22) (28/7/22.) The last letter from EJD to Pollard (17/1/25) shows anger and bitterness at being used and rejected as she perceives it, and asks pardon for her "officiousness and obtuseness."
